NOTES FOR DECK 1

The pontoon decks (1 to 4) are in pairs.

These two decks contain general cargo in the front and emergency batteries in the rear.


NOTES FOR DECK 3

The front portion of the port deck provides an entrance for the baggage, baggage conveyors and the Baggage Master's office.

The front portion of the starboard deck provides an entrance for the passengers, with info desk, and various offices for the Chief Purser and Chief Steward.

A kitchen for the crew is in the middle of both pontoons.

The rear portion of both pontoons contains crew's quarters, showers, etc.

NOTES FOR DECK 2

The rear half of these two decks contains the storage tanks from which fuel is pumped to service tanks in the auxiliary wing. The front of the starboard deck is for oil storage and the front of the port deck is for baggage storage.

NOTES FOR DECK 4

A Lookout Station is at the front of both pontoons. Behind are passenger staterooms. Further aft is the main kitchen, a crew's dining room, pantry, refrigerator, supply room, and 14 dumb-waiters for the dining rooms on upper decks. Wine racks are in the port deck.

Access to the water pumps and sewage equipment is from the starboard deck. These, as well as water tanks and fuel tanks, are stored between the two pontoons. The ceiling is not full height in this portion between the two pontoons.

The 6 lifeboats are carried on the stern. Each boat is 40 feet long and can hold 110 people with 2 weeks of supplies.

NOTES FOR DECK 5

The main lounge is at the front. Structurally, it is combined with the main wing and is located between the two pontoons.


The main dining room is situated to the rear of the lounge. On each side is a staircase and elevator which leads up to the mezzanine level where there are additional tables. Inset in the rear wall of the dining room is a raised orchestra platform.

The dining room can be transformed into a night club with a dance floor. Two private dining rooms are behind the main dining room.

The gym and solariums (one for males and one for females) are aft of the dining rooms. A barber shop and hairdresser's shop are also located here. On the port side is a bar and a souvenir shop. On the starboard side is a nurse's station, a doctor's office, and a nursery.

The recreation area is aft of the gym and solariums. Shuffleboards, Quoits, and even a Tennis court can be set up under the glass ceiling.

At the extreme aft end of each pontoon is a hangar for a small seaplane.
