

The mezzanine levels for the lounge and the dining room are located at the front.

On the port side is the telephone exchange center and a third private dining room for 14 people.

On the starboard side is a writing room and the library.

At the aft is another recreation level with deck games on each side. These two also have glass ceilings. Railings allow a view to the deck games on the level below.

The wings shown here do not have a full ceiling. The hydraulic equipment (HE) is accessed from the deck above.

The book HORIZONS by Norman Bel Geddes gives specific dimensions for the dining room, recreation areas, etc. It also states that 4 tennis courts can fit in the recreation area of Deck 5. This is simply not possible.

The book also mentions the dining room has a ceiling 36 feet high. This is also not possible.

A small orchestra typically has 25 to 50 musicians, yet the crew list in the book (page 121) mentions only 7 musicians.

So as to satisfy Norman's total crew of 155 people, most of the crew on Deck 3 have to be packed 4 to a room. This seems a bit extreme; 2 per room would be better.

Adjusted passenger / crew numbers result in the red numbers on Page 3 and Page 7.
